One scholarship equaling 50% of tuition and fees will be awarded for the 2025-2026 school year.

Selection Criteria:

- Minimum 2.8 GPA is required.
- Participation in extra-curricular activities that promote personal growth and service to others is desired.

Who was Dorothy Wendel Foley?

A former Twin Cities hometown girl and resident, Dorothy Wendel Foley attended the former Sacred Heart School from 2nd-8th grades in the 1930s. She was the class valedictorian. She then matriculated into Marinette High (National Honor Society member) and went on to attend Carroll College and graduate from UW-Madison. She double-majored in journalism and French, studied voice, and loved opera. Her professional accomplishments are many and include career stints with WMAM, the Marinette Eagle-Star, Pan American World Airways, Shell Oil Company, American Broadcasting Co., Martin Marietta Corp.

She married a tall Texan, had two daughters, loved Friday night fish fries, local charities, and her extended family. Once retired, Dorothy remained active with the local library, the Seattle Symphony, Pacific Northwest Ballet, and Seattle Opera Guild.

She was, in many ways, a woman ahead of her time and supremely adventuresome. This scholarship is established as a legacy to honor and commemorate hers!

As a journalist, creative and technical writer, Dorothy would likely offer the following advice to prospective scholars:

- Words have meaning. Use them wisely and accurately.
- Write descriptively and persuasively; conversationally if apropos.
- Be succinct.
- Be complete and thorough in your answers.
- Write with the reader in mind.
- Proof your work. Again. And again.
- Submit your application prior to the deadline.

Essay Questions (250-500 words each)

Tell us about your academic interests; what are your favorite subjects and why? (20 points)

If you could travel to a place you've never been, where would you go and why? (20 points)

Tell us about any musical interests. If you don't play a musical instrument or participate in choral activities, what instrument would you like to play? (20 points)

If you could learn any language, which one(s) would you choose and why? (20 points)

Tell us about your favorite extra-curricular activity. (20 points)

Who do you consider a strong female role model? (Optional)
